Dear Friends,

Last Sunday our summer ministry intern, Carter Grant, preached her third sermon at Forest Lake. If you haven't met Carter yet, you are missing something. Carter graduated from USC last May in Finance and International Business, but is seriously considering some form of full time church vocation. While she figures out what God's call and her gifts mean that she should be doing, she has worked for us full time this summer, learning from you what it looks like to live together as "Church". And by the time you read this, she will begin to transition back to working part-time for Forest Lake as our Youth Director, and part-time for the UKirk Presbyterian Campus Ministry that is a part of our Presbytery and sponsored by Shandon Presbyterian Church. Rev. John Cook is the PC (USA) Campus minister who leads that ministry, and John is happy to share Carter with us so that she can stay and work for both UKirk and for Forest Lake.

As I was listening to Carter preach, I was struck by the scene. At the front of the chancel was Carter (a smart, millennial person of faith), Rose Beacham (a smart, artistic, rising Junior at Richland Northeast High School) and me (let's just say I bring the average age up a bit!). Do you know how many churches would absolutely LOVE to have a young millennial preaching and a high school student leading worship? Sure, it may not be what we are used to. But, if we are serious about evangelism and serious about the growth and health of the church (not to mention FLPC), then we have to be seriously excited to listen to what these worship leaders have to tell us.

Also by the time you read this, Jodi Beckham will have completed her first day in the position of Director of Mission and Community Engagement, and Dan Holloway and Andrea Paschal will be living into their new duties. I fully anticipate that it is going to take some time before we will see the fruits of this new approach to our life and ministry together. But I am genuinely excited about the possibilities. It is not as it has been. And there is anxiety about that. But, if church were all about how we felt most comfortable, then we would never change. Instead, we believe that the purpose of the church is to be useful to God in the world. That means that what we do must first and foremost serve God's purpose, instead of our comfort and convenience. It seems that many of our leaders at every level have chosen to act in ways that protect the status quo because the status quo protects their power and profits. Disciples of Jesus Christ have always been a threat to that status quo, because they choose to act in ways that seek first the Kingdom of God. The status quo is not bad, but the reality is the world is changing. So when the status quo becomes an end or goal in itself (let's just keep things the same no matter what), it can keep us from seeing the larger picture or the greater good. Change is hard. But, wow, do we have some great youth and young adult leadership to help us negotiate the future. I am grateful for the youth and youth leaders at Forest Lake, and I am grateful to be part of a congregation on whom their message of faith, service and love will not be lost.

Energy Saving Measures - Heating & Air Conditioning

- Set Thermostats to 78F in summer, 68 F in winter.
- Run ceiling paddle fans on medium, blowing down in summer
- Run ceiling paddle fans on low, blowing up in winter
- Change heating/cooling filters monthly
- Insulate electric wall plugs and wall switches with foam pads.
- Caulk along baseboards with a clear sealant
- Caulk around plumbing penetrations that come through walls beneath bathroom and kitchen sinks
- Ensure attic access door closes tightly
- Insulate attic access door.
- Ensure return air grilles are not blocked by furniture or bookcases
- Ensure windows and doors are properly weather-stripped
- Make sure your outside soffit vents are not blocked

The kits will be available for purchase at the Connecting Point on Sundays beginning Sunday, May 13, 2018. On weekdays, the kits will be available in the Welcome Center. To purchase a kit, please deposit \$8 cash or a check payable to FLPC in the box located next to the kits. The \$8 covers the cost of the kit. The Service & Benevolence Ministry will use the proceeds to purchase additional kits.


