Instructions for Creating a Realm Account

1. You will get an email from Realm that says the following: "Forest Lake Presbyterian Church: Join our online community!" A screenshot is below.
2. Please click the link next to "Create an account."
3. You will then be taken to a page where you are asked to establish a password for your Realm account. After establishing your password, click "Register" at the bottom.
4. You will then be sent another email from Realm that says the following: "Forest Lake Presbyterian Church: Email Verification." Once you receive it, click the link next to "verify your email."
5. You should be all set!

MORE Justice, Make Your Voice Heard

Did you know FLPC partners with 34 other Columbia congregations to support the work of Midlands Organized Response for Equity and Justice - MORE Justice in our community?

Did you know in 2019 "South Carolina has, by far, the highest rate of evictions in the United States. This leads to severe housing instability for impoverished tenants. In 41 of 46 counties statewide, the average SC renter cannot afford a basic two-bedroom apartment without overextending their budget." 2019 South Carolina Housing Economic Impact Report

Did you know MORE Justice has been working on an affordable housing campaign for our community? Through the work of this affordable housing campaign, four Richland County Council members, Paul Livingston, Allison Terracio, Gretchen Barron, and Overture Walker said they would support the creation of an Affordable Housing Trust Fund. This was a huge victory for MORE Justice!

MORE Justice begins their cycle each year by holding listening sessions in order to allow YOU to speak about the issues that "keep you up at night," where would YOU like to see justice happen in our Columbia community?
