*PRAYER OF CONFESSION

We are quick to make excuses, afraid of the unknown and slow to risk discipleship that calls us away from the ordinary. We are embarrassed to tell others about our faith in Christ and seek out privilege, power and prestige. Forgive our sin. Forgive our uneven service and weak faith. Grant us the power of the Holy Spirit so that we may be renewed and re-focused, living lives of faithful and costly discipleship. Amen.

Season of Ordinary Time; the color of green reminds us of the life – of the Church, the life of the world and our lives as active disciples.

When this symbol * precedes an element of the service, please rise in body or spirit. **Bold print** is an invitation for the whole congregation to participate in worship by reading in unison.

A prayer of confession invites us to reflect on God’s purpose for our lives. When we do this, we realize how we have missed the mark. This confession of our fail- ures is not to make us feel bad, but to speak the truth about ourselves. The truth is that we sin. But the greater truth is that when we confess our sin, God’s nature is to forgive so that we are free to try again.

An assurance of pardon is one way of claiming God’s promised forgiveness and grace. We believe that when we repent of our sin and ask God to forgive us that God does in fact forgive us. We don’t need a preacher or priest to ask on our behalf. God deals with us directly as believers who seek to love and to follow.

Learning to worship takes time, and we include our youngest members in worship by inviting them to the front for Time with Young Disciples. We are patient with young disciples learning to worship because God is patient with those of us who are older who are also learning to worship God.

The Lord’s Prayer offers a good summary of much of Jesus’ teachings.

*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH *A Declaration of Faith – Chapter 9 – Christian Discipleship (ll. 7-11, 15-28 & 97-102)*

We confess that Christians today are called to discipleship. Life shared with Christ and shaped by Christ is God’s undeserved gift to each of us. It is also God’s demand upon every one of us, never perfectly fulfilled by any of us.

Christ calls us to live in disciplined freedom. Jesus came to set people free by the power of the gospel. In so doing he did not abolish, but fulfilled the law and the prophets. Through his teaching and the teaching of the apostles he showed what it is to be free and obedient. We declare Christ has freed us from trying to save ourselves by obeying the law. He restores to us God’s law as a gift and delight. The law describes concretely the shape of our freedom. When we accept its discipline, it keeps our personal lives from being chaotic and increases our effectiveness in the church’s mission.

Christ calls each of us to a life appropriate to that kingdom: to serve as he has served us; to take up our cross, risking the consequences of faithful discipleship; to walk by faith, not by sight, to hope for what we have not seen.

A Declaration of Faith was adopted by the Presbyterian Church in the United States (a precursor to our current denomination) in 1977 as a “contemporary statement of faith, a reliable aid for Christian study, liturgy and inspiration . . .” It includes much that speaks directly to our current context and is useful for study and worship.
