The Great Awakening's Impact on the American Revolution

with Dr. Richard J. Chacon

Dr. Richard J. Chacon is a Professor of Anthropology at Winthrop University. Currently, he conducts research on the rise of inequality and social complexity across the globe. He is the author of 10 academic books which include *The Great Awakening* and *Southern Backcountry Revolutionaries*, co-authored with Michael Scoggins (2014). He has held visiting positions at the University of Gothenburg, Sweden, the Russian State University for the Humanities in Moscow, and at the University of Costa Rica. Dr. Chacon has delivered 49 scholarly presentations in university settings in foreign countries, and he has given 116 academic lectures at scientific gatherings within the US.

In addition to his career in wealth management, John Allison's love for SC Archaeology and Revolutionary War history has made him a national expert on the subject. John has located and defined more lost Revolutionary War battlefields in the Carolinas than anyone else. John is a board member of the SC Archaeological Research Trust, Vice Chairman of the South Carolina American Revolution Trust, and a founding member of the Southern Campaigns of the American Revolution (SCAR) Round Table. In 2023, John was named the Distinguished Archaeologist of the Year by the Archaeological Society of South Carolina.

Judge Currie is a Senior United States District Judge for the District of South Carolina and hears civil and criminal cases in the Columbia Division. She received a BA from the University of South Carolina and a Juris Doctor from the George Washington University School of Law. She served as an Assistant United States Attorney in the District of Columbia and the District of South Carolina and was the first Chief Deputy Attorney General of the State Grand Jury of South Carolina. She was nominated to the federal bench in 1994 and confirmed by the United States Senate on March 10, 1994.
